The ShoreLake Arts Fellowship is a unique, mentored opportunity to work at a prominent arts non-profit supporting arts education and public programs. This is a significant opportunity for university level students to advance their careers and gain experience in both a classroom and professional non-profit setting.



Immersive Experience

This 9 week program is split over 3 areas of the arts:





60% Arts Education

Work collaboratively with the Arts Education Coordinator to develop and prepare educational curriculum, lead daily youth classes for our camps, as well as identify and create educational resources for students.



15% Public Programs

Support our robust schedule of public programs and planning efforts, learn the inner workings of gallery management, and even have a chance to pitch your own ideas for programming.



25% Professional Education

Learn directly from experienced staff members about all aspects of running an arts nonprofit and gallery, including grant writing, fundraising, public communications, advocacy, and more.

Summer Cycle Schedule

The Fellowship runs June 21 - August 27, with flexibility, at the Shoreline Center. Fellows are on site Monday through Friday and work an average of 20-25 hours per week.



MORNINGS

Required; You will be required to be on site from 9am - 12pm
Monday through Friday to lead small-group youth programming and camps.



AFTERNOONS

Flexible; based on your personal schedule & interest. We will work together to identify the programs or projects you are most interested in and build your schedule from there together.



WEEKENDS

Optional; You are welcome to participate in our weekend and evening events, learning about the behind-the-scenes activities that make public programs happen!
